Currently, the CATS Project is in its sixth year of operation, and is funded at \$858,000 annually, providing assessment, treatment, and training services. UK CATS Project also includes a strong research component, which has yielded refereed papers and presentations, workshops, and research posters. Conceptual and empirical investigation manuscripts have been published beginning in 2002. The project also includes a major training site for clinical and research for multidisciplinary graduate and doctoral students.
