School of Social Work Timeline

1918 – Dr. Raymond F. Bellamy joins the faculty of the Florida State College for Women as a professor of sociology and later teaches the first course on campus in “social welfare work.”

1928 – Dr. Coyle E. Moore, the second member of the sociology faculty, comes to the Florida State College for Women and develops several social work related courses.

1938 – The department of Sociology becomes the department of Sociology and Social Work. The faculty swells to three members as Margaret C. Bristol joins Bellamy and Moore.

1947 – Florida State College for Women becomes Florida State University. Social Work becomes a separate department, with Coyle Moore as its chairman.

1948 – The MSW program is started with a class of five students.

1950 – The School of Social Welfare is created. Coyle Moore is named dean, and the MSW program is accredited by the American Association of Schools of Social Work.

1968 – Dr. Bernhard Scher becomes the second dean of the School of Social Welfare when Dr. Moore retires.

1973 – The School of Social Welfare splits to become the School of Social Work (with Dr. L. Diane Bernard as dean) and the School of Criminology.

1974 – The undergraduate Social Work program gains accreditation by the Council on Social Work Education.

1975 – The doctoral program in Social Work is initiated with five students enrolled.

1976 – The first off-campus program, located in Orlando, begins.

1977 – The first Ph.D. in Social Work is awarded.

1978 – Dr. Patricia Vance is named acting dean.

1979 – Dr. D. Ray Bardill becomes dean of the School of Social Work.

1982 – The Panama City program becomes an extension of the Florida State University campus and social work courses are offered.

1993 – A formal program of studies leading to the bachelor’s degree is initiated on the Panama City campus.

1994 – Dr. Dianne Harrison Montgomery is named dean of the School of Social Work.

1997 – The School of Social Work moves to the newly constructed University Center.

2000 – Dr. Fred Seidl becomes interim dean.

2001 – Dr. C. Aaron McNeece is named the *Walter W. Hudson Professor of Social Work*, becoming the first named professor in the School’s history. Dr. McNeece also assumes the role of interim dean.

Recent Physical Locations

The School of Social Work was located in the Bellamy Building from 1967 to 1996. After outgrowing its space in Bellamy, the School moved to newly constructed quarters at the University Center in December 1996. In addition to administrative, faculty and staff offices, the new Social Work facility included three conference rooms, five electronically equipped classrooms, and a state-of-the-art computer lab and skills lab.

Technology Resources at the School of Social Work

The School of Social Work is committed to providing students, faculty, and staff with the latest technologies to aid in their instructional and research missions. To accomplish this goal, the electronic classrooms were designed with the goal of enhancing and supplementing normal classroom activities. In addition, the Computer Lab and the Skills Lab were opened as adjuncts to normally scheduled classrooms, and as mediums by which research can be planned, implemented, analyzed, and reported.

Computer Lab

The Social Work Computer Lab offers all students ready access to the most up-to-date social work research on the World Wide Web. Our department LAN, a local network of all social work students, faculty, and staff, is equipped with 100 MB ethernet access which allows files to be shared quickly and easily. Computer conferencing software allows students and faculty to enter "chat room" discussions that take place in real time and are recorded for anyone who missed the original conference. Many professors have course information and materials posted via FSU's Blackboard web access software. Technologies are constantly being updated.

In Fall 2001 the computer lab has the following equipment:

- 24 650 MHz Pentium III computers running Windows 98 operating system
- Available applications include Office 97 and 2000, Corel 10 Suite, SPSS 10.07, Netscape 4x, Internet Explorer 5x, Eudora 5, and Adobe Acrobat 5
- Email and internet access via 10 MB ethernet access
- An HP ScanJet 4300 C Flatbed Scanner
- Two high speed B/W laser printers
- A ceiling-mounted data projector, which can project material from the instructor's workstation onto the screen
- A videotape player allowing videos to be played through the ceiling-mounted data projector
- All computers are equipped with CD Webstream Sound access via headphone

Skills Lab

The Social Work Skills Lab was created for demonstrating and rehearsing social work practice skills. The Lab is actually a suite of rooms: one is the interviewing room and the other is the observational room. The interviewing room resembles a practitioner's office and can accommodate up to 10 people. The interviews can be observed through a one way mirror in the observational room.

In 2001, components of the interviewing room include:

- Ceiling-mounted microphone
- Two genlocked cameras controlled in the observational room
- CC TV
- Pentium II computer equipped with screen reader software

Components of the observational room include:

- Audio amplifier
- Character generator
- Two monitors
- Videotape recorder/player
- Audio mixer

Using the equipment in the observational room, the events and speech in the interviewing room can be videotaped and shown in split-screen. Presumably, these images will be of the social work practitioner and her/his clientele.

Electronic Classrooms

Each classroom in the School of Social Work is equipped with a multimedia computer, VCR, SVGA Data/Video projector, and amplified speaker. Professors can create multimedia presentations and project them onto the screen as well as computer data and video presentations. The classrooms are also equipped with Internet access whereby professors can use the World Wide Web as a learning tool during class time.

Social Work Outreach Programs

The Boys' Choir of Tallahassee

The Boys' Choir of Tallahassee was founded in August 1995 as an outreach program for males, ages 7-18 who live in neighborhoods with limited social and economic opportunities. The Choir promotes habits, attitudes and values consistent with the physical, mental and social well-being of its members. It builds a network of support for its members and offers them a means of social and musical expression and recreation. Learning and performing choral music teaches discipline and an organized use of time. Another important goal of the Choir is to demonstrate the great potential these young people have for positive contributions to the community, the state and the nation.

The Boys' Choir meets three times a week for study sessions and rehearsals where the boys not only work on their music, but are also required to finish their homework. The boys are given the opportunity to travel, performing at churches and at various functions throughout the South. They helped Tallahassee earn the designation of All American City in 1999. In the summer of 2000 the Choir traveled to several cities in Italy and had the opportunity to perform at Mass in the Vatican.

The Family Visitation Program of Tallahassee

The Family Visitation Program offers a place for parents with court ordered supervised visitation to see their children. This program was founded in May 1995 with the goal of providing a safe and structured environment where children may visit with non-custodial parents on a regular basis. Social Work interns, working with professional social workers as visitation supervisors, are trained in various subjects, including parenting skills, child development, alcohol and drug abuse, and child abuse and neglect.

The Institute for Family Violence Studies

The Institute was formed in 1995 to research family violence as it occurs in all age groups and to distribute the findings of this research at the local, state, national, and international levels. It is a regional clearinghouse on resources related to family violence. The staff works to evaluate the effectiveness of family violence interventions and to develop innovative new programs for reducing family violence. The Institute is committed to developing a stronger family violence curriculum within social work and to providing training to those working in social service agencies. Through work in the School of Social Work and the Community, the Institute seeks to create greater awareness about family violence issues and to promote the creation of effective programs to reduce family violence.

The Green Cross Project

The Green Cross Projects emerged in response to the immediate needs in Oklahoma City following the bombing of the Federal Building there in 1995. In collaboration with members of the Traumatic Stress Forum (a member of InterPsych consortium), the Psychosocial Stress Research Program designed a traumatology training program for Oklahoma professionals. The Oklahoma Green Cross Project was initially called, "Operation Healing Oklahoma."

With the encouragement of Florida State University, under the direction of Dr. Charles Figley, Professor in the School of Social Work the Green Cross Projects (GCP) has evolved since its initial inception. Initially, the GCP established the Registered Traumatologist certification to designate those qualified to work with traumatized people. Today, the Traumatology Institute took over that function and accredits both individuals and training sites. Each trainee who seeks certification becomes an interim member of the GCP and a full member upon receipt of their certification.

The Green Cross Foundation is dedicated to supporting the GCP. The Foundation is a non-profit corporation in the State of Florida and registered with the US Internal Revenue Service as an educational foundation. The Foundation seeks and disburses funds in support of the field of traumatology. Of special interest are humanitarian efforts, standards of practice in research, consultation, education, and policy development. The Foundation has a special relationship with the Florida State University in support of the Traumatology Institute and its Green Cross Projects.

The Trinity Institute for the Addictions

The Trinity Institute was created to provide a multidisciplinary center for the advancement and distribution of knowledge about the addictions. Using expertise of the faculty from the Florida State University School of Social Work and the University of Miami Medical College and Research Centers,

the School of Social Work will be hosting scholars and practitioners with the latest information on addictions.

As proposed, the Trinity Institute will:

- become a foremost authority on practice and research on the addictions.
- rely on a foundation of science and practice wisdom in its work.
- represent a wide range of disciplines, professions, and practice models.
- use advanced computer and telecommunication technologies in fulfilling its mission.
- produce both paper and CD-ROM versions of a Handbook of the Addictions.
- sponsor teleconferenced professional updates.
- host a yearly conference on the addictions.
- be a public/private partnership of universities, agencies, and government

Certificate Programs, Dual Degree Programs, and Interdisciplinary Concentrations

The Florida State University School of Social Work has demonstrated a deep commitment to the encouragement of proficiency in fields of specialization. The following programs offer students the opportunity to concentrate intensively on a specific aspect of social work practice and in some cases to expand their knowledge base with other fields of study.

Family Social Work Practice Certificate Program

In 1989, this became the first certificate program offered by the School of Social Work. The certificate program in Family Social Work Practice is for MSW Clinical Concentration students who wish to develop advanced competence in couple and family treatment. The program affords an opportunity for eligible students to develop a specialization area beyond the rigorous demands of the clinical social work concentration. Requirements for a specialty in family social work practice include a total of 69 credit hours for the Non-Advanced Standing student (nine hours beyond the normal 60 credits) and 48 credit hours for the Advanced Standing student (nine credits beyond the required 39 hours). Non-Advanced Standing students could complete the certificate program within their regular course of studies by taking course work in the summer (between their first and second year). Advanced Standing students could attend an additional term in order to complete the certificate requirements.

Child Welfare Practice Certificate Program

The certificate program in Child Welfare Practice, first offered in Fall 2000, is designed for students who wish to develop additional skills in child welfare practice. This program offers both undergraduate and graduate students an opportunity to focus their curriculum on issues related to child welfare. Course work addresses issues such as: the prevention of problems which result in neglect, abuse, exploitation, or delinquency of children, the protection of homeless, dependent or maltreated children; the strengthening of families to maintain children in their own homes; the development of advocacy groups, and analysis of social policies and mental health issues related to these populations. Child welfare practitioners provide a continuum of services in both public and private sectors. To earn the certificate, students must complete specific child welfare coursework, earn a minimum B+ grade in

each of the required courses taken for the program, successfully complete an approved Field Instruction course focused on child welfare practice, and complete a related paper or project proposed by the student and accepted by the certificate committee.

Certificate Program in Addiction Studies

This certificate program is designed to provide students with in-depth educational preparation for competent practice in addiction services. These courses also meet the educational requirements of the Certification Board of Addiction Professionals of Florida (BBAPF). Students enrolled in the Certificate Program in Addiction Studies will complete the required educational hours in addiction, ethics, and HIV/AIDS course content.

Certificate in Aging Studies Program

The FSU Pepper Institute on Aging and Public Policy offers an opportunity for concentrated education in aging studies. It provides an educational credential for students with an interest in aging which indicates their completion of a multi-disciplinary course of study of aging and old age.

The Arts and Community Practice Certificate Program

The certificate program in the Arts and Community Practice is designed for undergraduate and graduate students who wish to develop a focused concentration on the application of the arts to community development. This is inclusive of groups and families, and addresses all stages of human development. Particular attention is given to prevention, enrichment, and response to social concerns. The certificate program, started in 1998, is intended for students in the School of Social Work and the School of Visual Arts and Dance.

The requirements include course work in dance, art education/therapy, and social work totaling 12 credits with at least 3 credits taken from each program. Students must earn a minimum "B" grade in all courses taken for the certificate. An additional requirement is the completion of a major paper linking theory and practice. Each student will also be involved in an applied experience unique to that student's academic discipline.

M.S.W./M.P.A. Dual Degree Program

FSU's Reuben O'D. Askew School of Public Administration & Policy and the School of Social Work offer a joint degree program leading to a Master of Social Work and a Master of Public Administration. This program, one of the few joint degree programs in these fields offered in the U.S., was created in 1989 to prepare students for positions in public, private and nonprofit human service organizations which require both social work and management knowledge.

M.S.W./J.D. Dual Degree Program

This program is designed for students interested in combining a Master of Social Work degree with a degree in law. Initiated in 1995, this is a three-year program. For the Clinical Concentration, 136 credits must be earned, 82 of which are in the College of Law and 54 are in the School of Social Work. Social Policy and Administrative Concentration students need three fewer credits in Law, making the total 133. Advanced Standing students must take 115 credits for the Clinical Concentration or 109 credits for the Social Policy and Administrative Concentration. Students in the joint degree

program spend their final MSW field placement in a Law/Social Work program such as the *Children's Advocacy Center* or the Attorney General's Office. Graduates go into areas such as family law, child advocacy, domestic violence, public policy, and public defense.

M.S.W./Ph.D. Dual Degree Program

The M.S.W./Ph.D. dual degree program, first offered in 1997, gives students the opportunity to receive both their Masters and Doctoral Degrees in four years.

M.S.W./M.B.A. Concentration

FSU's College of Business and the School of Social Work have joined in a partnership that is intended to prepare the student for positions in public, private and nonprofit human service organizations which require both social work and management knowledge.

Ph.D. in Marriage and Family

In 1988, the school began its participation in the Interdivisional Doctoral Program in Marriage and Family. In cooperation with the College of Social Sciences and the College of Human Sciences, the School of Social Work began offering students the opportunity to earn a Ph.D. in marriage and the family. The objective of the program is to enable students to contribute to marriage and family theory, research, and practice.

Interdisciplinary Graduate Minor in Dispute Resolution

This minor, developed in 1998, provides an opportunity for students to develop expertise in dispute resolution in conjunction with a variety of graduate programs in several schools and colleges at the Florida State University. The course requirement for an interdisciplinary minor is twelve hours. At least nine hours are to be outside the major department; three hours may be in approved courses in the major program. Courses must be from at least two different departments other than the major department. While an internship is not required for this minor, up to 3 hours of the required hours may be earned in an internship.

Curriculum

The Undergraduate Program

Directors of the Undergraduate Program 1990 - 2001

Betty Piccard was the Director of the Undergraduate Program until she retired in 1993. Christy Baker took over the position until 1995, followed by Gloria Duran Aguilar. The current director, Kim Maddox, has held the position since 1997.

Program Description

The Undergraduate Social Work Program is designed to prepare students to work as generalist social workers in a variety of settings with diverse population groups. Generalist social workers utilize a wide range of knowledge and skills to assess problems comprehensively, including information from multiple

levels and various size systems. Beginning-level generalist practitioners are also prepared to intervene at multiple practice levels, from individuals to communities. The ecosystems perspective serves as an organizing framework and provides an effective basis for generalist social work practice.

In order to attain competency as generalist practitioners, students must first master content in liberal studies. A liberal arts perspective fosters a spirit of free inquiry into humane values, while developing the mind as an instrument of analysis and synthesis. An understanding of one's self and of the natural and social environment is essential to true knowledge development and to responsible participation in society. Liberal studies are intended to provide a perspective on the qualities, accomplishments, and aspirations of human beings, the past and present civilizations they have created, and the natural and technological world they inhabit.

All graduates of FSU must complete a set of required liberal studies courses, including courses in mathematics, English, history, social science, natural science, and humanities/fine arts. (For more specific information about liberal studies requirements, please consult the [FSU General Bulletin](#).) Both four-year and transfer students from other institutions must meet the same requirements.

The Undergraduate Social Work Program is built upon this solid liberal arts foundation. Without prior courses in humanities, fine arts, history, and social science, students might lack the ability to fully appreciate cultural diversity and human behavior in its broadest sense. Courses in history and social science help students to understand systems of various sizes: individuals, groups, and communities. Both mathematics and English composition skills are key components to the development of critical thinking and reasoning skills. English language skills, both oral and written, are also a central element of good communication skills, which are necessary with social work practice in any setting.

In addition, our program has identified five content areas which provide specific foundation for the development of social work knowledge and skills: human biology, American national government, economics, psychology, and sociology. These courses help to ensure that students have direct knowledge of social, psychological, and biological determinants of human behavior, along with knowledge of diverse cultures, social conditions, and social problems. Our social work curriculum builds upon this foundation, and integrates this content throughout students' programs of study.

Goals and Objectives

It is the goal of the baccalaureate program in social work at Florida State University to prepare students for entry-level, generalist social work practice with diverse client systems and problems. In order to achieve this goal, we have established the following educational objectives for students. Graduates of our program will be able to:

- Apply the knowledge and skills of generalist social work to practice with systems of all sizes (CPS B5.7.6), demonstrating the professional use of self (CPS B5.7.3), the use of effective communication skills and critical thinking skills (CPS B5.7.1, CPS B5.7.10), and the use of supervision appropriate to generalist practice (CPS B5.7.11).
- Understand the history of social welfare and the social work profession and practice within the values and ethics of the social work profession (CPS B5.7.2, CPS B5.7.5).
- Have an understanding of and respect for diversity, and advocate for social and economic justice (CPS B5.7.2, CPS B5.7.4).

- Apply knowledge of biopsychosocial variables and theoretical frameworks to understand individuals, families, groups, organizations, and communities (CPS B5.7.7).
- Analyze the impact of social policies on client systems, workers, agencies, communities, and nations, and seek changes in social policies and organizational practices (CPS B5.7.8, CPS B.7.12).
- Evaluate and apply research findings to practice, and under supervision, evaluate their own practices (CPS B5.7.9, CPS B.7.11).

These goals and objectives are consistent with the Council on Social Work Education's Curriculum Policy Statement (CPS), and reflect the purpose, values, and ethics of the social work profession. The full text of the Curriculum Policy Statement can be found at www.cswe.org.

The Master of Social Work Degree

Mission Statement

It is the mission of the Florida State University School of Social Work to provide quality educational services at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels that prepare social workers to enhance human well-being and help meet the basic needs of diverse populations with particular attention to the empowerment of people who are vulnerable, oppressed, and/or living in poverty. The School of Social Work also has as its purpose to contribute to the knowledge base that supports social work practice and social policy development and to provide community service at the local, state, and national levels.

The Goals of the School of Social Work

The goal of the *master's program in social work* at Florida State University is to provide quality preparation for advanced practitioners who will work with diverse client systems and problems. Toward this end, the *master's program in social work* will prepare students who:

- understand the history of social welfare and the social work profession and who can practice within the values and ethics of the social work profession;
- have an understanding of and respect for diversity and work toward social and economic justice;
- are aware of their responsibility to continue their professional growth and development;
- can critically analyze the impact of social policies on client systems, workers, agencies, communities, and nations, and seek changes in social policies and practices;
- can critically evaluate and apply research findings to practice and further evaluate their own practices and disseminate findings; and
- are able to apply the knowledge and skills of advanced social work practice in an area of concentration.

Further goals of the master's program are to:

- remain vital and progressive by actively pursuing ongoing relationships and exchanges with social work practitioners; groups that develop, implement, and benefit from social policies and services; professional associations; and disciplines and departments in the academic community;
- assume responsibility for systematic and high quality scholarship that evaluates social work practice and develops and advances knowledge; and
- provide service to the people of the state of Florida.

The Master of Social Work degree program is designed to enable students to develop advanced professional competence by providing a curriculum that includes social work practice, social policy, knowledge of human behavior and the social environment, social work research, and field instruction. The curriculum has been developed to emphasize the common elements in all social work practice areas so that persons receiving this professional degree will be able to practice in a variety of community-based agencies and settings. At the master's level, a student chooses to concentrate in one of these two areas: Community-Based Clinical Social Work which includes services to individuals, families and groups; and Social Policy and Administration which incorporates both direct and indirect methods of interventions. Part-time programs in Tallahassee and at off-campus locations in Gainesville, Jacksonville, and Pensacola and at FSU's Panama City Branch Campus incorporate the full time academic program over an extended period of time.

M.S.W. Curriculum

During the first year (of full time study), the foundation curriculum content emphasizes generalist social work practice, and students complete a 10 credit hour field placement. In the second year, students begin the advanced concentrations course work. During their last semester, students have a block field placement consisting of 12 credit hours along with a 3 credit hour Advanced Seminar course. These internships may be done outside of Tallahassee in locations around the State of Florida where field faculty are employed and teach the Seminar. A minimum of 61 credit hours is required for graduation. Enrollment in the summer semester is optional. A variety of elective courses will be available, and students may strengthen their preparation in substantive areas or practice modalities through these summer offerings. Note: Only the Clinical Concentration is available in Gainesville, Jacksonville, Panama City and Pensacola.

Advanced Standing M.S.W. Curriculum

The Advanced Standing Program is normally completed in three semesters. A minimum of 39 credit hours must be completed. Students take required, concentration options, and elective courses in the first two semesters and the Integrative Seminar (3 credits) and Field Instruction (12 credits) in their last semester.

Graduates of our ***Clinical Social Work Concentration*** will be able to:

- Assess, diagnose, and treat clients' problems through individual, couple, family, and group modalities.
- Facilitate clients gaining access to appropriate community resources.
- Work cooperatively and collaboratively with other human service professionals, including policy makers, to plan and implement services to clients.

- Conduct empirical evaluations of their own practice interventions.

Graduates of our *Social Policy and Administration Concentration* will be able to:

- Provide leadership in agency-based practice agencies in the public and private sector.
- Analyze social policies and demonstrate effective strategies for change that contribute to social and economic justice.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of social programs, agencies, and policies.
- Develop effective, collaborative, and cooperative endeavors with other professional social workers and agencies.

The goals and objectives of the MSW program directly reflect the guidelines specified by the Council on Work Education (CSWE) Curriculum Policy Statement, reflecting the purpose, values and ethics of the social work profession and the principles of social work education. The mission of the school was developed through an extensive faculty process and is threaded throughout course objectives, class content and assignments with attention to foundation and advanced practice concepts.

Ph.D. Program

Directors of the Doctoral Program 1990 - 2001

The current director of the program, Dr. Wendy Crook, assumed the position earlier this year. Previous directors were Dianne Montgomery, Neil Abell, Fred Seidl, and C. Aaron McNeece.

Program Goals and Objectives:

- A. To foster the creation, validation, and dissemination of social work research upon which social work practice and social welfare policy are founded
- B. To improve the quality of both direct and indirect social work practice in a community-based framework
- C. To improve the quality of social work education
- D. To improve the social welfare of society in general

Degree Requirements:

The doctoral program is typically based upon a master's degree in social work plus substantial professional social work experience. Generally, the Ph.D. can be completed in three calendar years of full-time study, although individual differences can be expected. A Program of Studies is also available for those interested in a joint MSW/Ph.D. Program.

All students are expected to demonstrate competency by completing a qualifying examination, a specialization area paper, and a preliminary examination in either:

- A. Direct Practice Social Work or Social Policy
- B. Philosophy of Science/Research

A doctoral dissertation, judged by a student's supervisory committee to make a significant contribution to the social work knowledge base, is required.

In addition to a strong research curriculum, the school emphasizes, as part of its training, the development of expertise in teaching. Substantial opportunities are provided for assisted and independent

instruction. Graduates are well prepared for academic careers in research and teaching. Historically, many of our alumni have gone on to obtain tenured positions at top universities in the country.

Program Variations:

Although all students have a core research sequence, students may elect a specialization. A part-time program is available, [however course work and preliminary examination must be completed within a five year period]. Regular admission to the Doctoral Program is required for all part time students.

In conjunction with the School of Social Work mission statement, it is the objective of the Ph.D. Program to educate and graduate doctoral students who contribute to:

1. The Social Work Research and Practice Knowledge Base

- A. On the average, students will have published at least one referred article while enrolled in the Ph.D. program.
- B. On the average, within three years of graduation, graduates will have published at least two articles in refereed journals that are relevant to social work practice and/or education.

2. Social Work Education

- A. While enrolled in the Ph.D. Program, all students will have an experience that involves teaching or assisting in the teaching of a social work course.
- B. At least 75% of alum's will secure employment in Schools or Departments of Social Work.

3. The Professional Social Work Community

- A. While enrolled in the Ph.D. Program and following graduation, all students will make a contribution to the professional social work community by attending, participating in, or presenting at a relevant meeting, seminar, workshop, or conference.

4. The Citizens of the Local and State Communities

- A. While enrolled in the Ph.D. Program all students will have at least one of the following experiences:
 - 1. volunteering or being employed at a social or mental health agency
 - 2. doing advocacy or grassroots organization
 - 3. writing or working on a grant that provides resources to the citizens of Florida.

In order to achieve these outcomes, the Ph.D. Program will hold students to the academic and professional standards and expectations that are stipulated by the University, the National Association of Social Workers and the Council on Social Work Education.

Part-Time Programs

Off-Campus Bachelor Programs

The Florida State University School of Social Work offers a fully credited part-time (evening) baccalaureate degree at the FSU Panama City Branch campus. A new daytime, full time undergraduate program began Fall, 2000.

Off-Campus MSW Programs

The off campus Part-Time MSW Program continued to change and expand. Unlike the early years, FSU was no longer the only State University to offer such a degree. By the end of the decade, we faced competition from seven other public institutions.

Janet K. Berry became the Director of the Part-Time Programs in 1998. We continued to graduate classes in Jacksonville, Panama City, Gainesville and Pensacola. A total of 142 off campus students earned their MSW in Fall, 1999.

In Gainesville, a new cohort of 22 students began the Traditional, Non-Advanced Standing program in Spring, 2000. This was advertised and remained a "weekend" only format of instruction. Karen Keroack was the Area Coordinator. A new cohort of Non-Advanced Standing students started the following semester in Jacksonville, with Leslie Allen as the Area Coordinator. This class had 18 students. Panama City followed in Fall, 2000, with an Advanced Standing cohort of 13. The Area Coordinator there, Claire Calohan, was joined by two new faculty members, Arlene Shaheen and Forrest Yanke.

Efforts to start a Traditional cohort in Pensacola were unsuccessful. Despite our remaining the only currently CSWE accredited graduate school north of Orlando, and south of Atlanta, the number of applicants did not warrant a program. The history of this site shows more response and interest from BSW's. Plans are to establish an Advanced Standing Program in Fall, 2002.

During Spring, 2001, Advanced Standing students were added in Gainesville. Summer, 2001, saw the enrollment in Jacksonville double with the addition of an Advanced Standing cohort. Panama City added a Traditional, Non-Advanced Standing cohort that semester as well.

Britton Wright was hired as the Area Coordinator in the summer of 2001. His geographical area covered the central part of the State. A collaborative agreement with St. Leo University was established. They will house the program and provide office space at no charge.

Students at the various sites enrolled in two courses per semester. The Traditional 61 credit program students earn degrees in three years. Students in Advanced Standing 39 credit programs completed their degree requirements in two years. All off-campus classes were taught either one evening per week during the semester, or a total of three Friday night, Saturday and Sunday sessions.

Faculty from the Tallahassee campus continued to be very supportive of the Part-Time Program. Through the Center of Professional Development, they are compensated for working overload, above their assigned responsibilities. The percentage of faculty teaching off-campus reflected the commitment to this program. For the 2000-2001 school year, 97% of courses were taught by faculty.

Field Instruction

Field Instruction is an important component of the program and is designed to ensure that each student completes an educationally supervised agency placement, which offers learning experiences that:

1. Enhance the student's ability to translate theory into effective social work practice;
2. Broaden the student's range of skills for performing high quality social work functions;
3. Strengthen the student's awareness of attitudes, motivations, and judgments identified with the profession of social work

The Office of Field Instruction is responsible for the assignment of internships after collaboration with students, faculty advisors, and prospective field agencies. Each placement is made on an individual basis. Field instruction agencies to which students are assigned are carefully selected on the basis of the quality of their professional practice, range of educationally appropriate activities, and their ability to make personnel and resources available for this purpose.

Field Instruction provides the educational component where knowledge, values, and skills learned in the classroom are tested, reinforced and integrated in a disciplined manner. The purpose of field instruction is to provide students with opportunities for development and reinforcement of competence through performance in actual service situations. As students undertake learning tasks within the reality of agency life, a vehicle is established whereby constructive use of theory, acquired through course work, can be applied, attitudes and values examined, and skills developed and refined. Between 1999-2000, 483 students were placed in internships statewide, which is 241,500 internship hours.

The Office of Field Instruction is staffed by a Director of Field Instruction, on and off-campus Field Faculty, an office assistant, student assistants and field faculty adjuncts. Off-campus Field Faculty, known as "area coordinators" are located around the state of Florida to offer students field placements in a variety of rural and urban settings. They are located in Jacksonville, Gainesville, Panama City, Pensacola, Tampa Bay, Orlando and Miami. The following individuals have filled the position of Director of Field Instruction since 1990:

The following internships are available to students internationally:

- London, England: Various placements are offered in a variety of different settings, depending on the semester
- Valencia, Spain: Placements are offered at the Refugee Center and at a local hospital. The placement at the Refugee Center is totally funded by the FSU Human Rights Center. Students placed in Spain must be Spanish-speaking.
- Barbados: Placements are at the National Council on Substance Abuse (SPA placement), the Psychiatric Hospital, or at the National Assistance Board.

- Trinidad: Placements are at the Child Guidance Clinic located at the Children's Hospital in Mt. Hope (near the University of the West Indies) in Port of Spain.
- St. Vincent in the Grenadines: Placement is at the Marion House, an agency that provides direct services to students, adolescents, and families in the areas of substance abuse, parenting, etc.
- British Virgin Islands: A placement is being offered at the British Virgin Islands Mental Health Program in Tortola, an outpatient psychiatric clinic.

International Initiatives

Since 1998, students and faculty have been involved with projects from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission in South Africa to the Caribbean Basin Initiative. Working and learning internationally is especially suited for social work's primary focus, helping people in the context of their socio-cultural, political, and economic environments. Recently, School of Social Work faculty have taught courses in England, Ireland, France, Spain, Barbados, St. Vincent, and the Czech Republic.

This work allows students to gain a global perspective and professors to bring back examples from working directly with indigenous cultures. All participants have an opportunity to hone their cross-cultural skills and to compare America's social welfare systems and politics with those of other countries.

The broadening experiences come packaged in a number of ways: academic credit courses, continuing education courses, and humanitarian and service missions to offer training and technical assistance. Programs range from a week to a semester in length.

Academic credit courses are offered primarily through FSU's International Programs Office, which has greatly expanded the venues in which there are FSU campuses worldwide. FSU students and professors reside in London, Florence, or Valencia for a month to a semester and take courses for credit in their program of study. An alternative, which some students pursued recently in Prague, is taking advantage of a directed individual study (DIS), whereby the student and professor design a course to pursue in that location and for which the student receives credit.

Social Work faculty have been involved in social work missions in the Caribbean for 10 years, assisting social workers and governmental agencies to address the social ills of the area.

Field placement opportunities have recently begun to be offered internationally as well. The School of Social Work currently has placement opportunities available in London, England and Valencia, Spain, Barbados, Trinidad, St. Vincent in the Grenadines and the British Virgin Islands.

School Organizations and Services

Association of Students in Social Work

The Association of Students in Social Work (ASSW) is open to all undergraduate and graduate social work students. Early in the fall semester each year the ASSW elects members to serve on its Executive Board and faculty committees. Advanced Standing and Non-Advanced Standing graduate students and undergraduate students are represented on the Executive Board.

Robert P. Hurrle Scholarship in Field Instruction

Robert Hurrle was a Lt. Colonel in the United States Air Force who spent his retirement years in the Tallahassee community with his wife Sarah. When Sarah passed away, Col. Hurrle decided to establish a trust that would provide financial contributions to charitable and educational entities. Col. Hurrle died in June 2000 and the Hurrle Scholarship was created later that year to honor his wishes. Margaret H. Jacks Scholarship

Margaret Harwick Jacks, a social worker by profession, was a formidable and outspoken advocate for elderly Floridians for more than five decades. She started her career as a public welfare social worker and went on to become the first director of Florida's Division on Aging. After retirement, she served on countless advisory councils and boards through which she influenced public policy, affecting the lives of many senior citizens. Even more significantly, she volunteered hundreds of hours

successfully "educating" both the Florida congressional delegation and members of the Florida Legislature regarding programs, services, and funds that would benefit our frail elders who are unable to live independently.

Margaret Jacks' many accomplishments did not go unnoticed; admired and loved by her colleagues and peers, she was an inspiration and role model to younger advocates who would follow in her footsteps. Over the years, she was recognized for her contributions to public policy by Florida governors, the Florida Association of Social Workers, the Florida Council on Aging, and many other groups with whom she was affiliated.

So great were her contributions that the late Florida Governor, Lawton Chiles, during his tenure as a U.S. Senator, gave tribute to her on February 18, 1988, which was entered into the Congressional Record of the 100th Congress.

The purpose of the Margaret H. Jacks Scholarship is to encourage and support highly motivated graduate students in social work to specialize in the study of, and practice within, the field of aging.

Coyle and Mabel Moore Scholarship

Coyle E. Moore, Ph.D., came to the Florida State College for Women in 1928 to develop a course of instruction in social welfare. He envisioned a program that would transcend boundaries of state and region, both geographically and academically. His far-sighted perception of the potential in this area inevitably met with mixed reactions, ranging from apathy, to opposition, to acceptance. The challenging need for such a program, nonetheless, stimulated his creativity to such an extent that his efforts were rewarded with phenomenal success. With the conversion of FSCW to University status in 1947, Professor Moore was appointed Dean of the School of Social Welfare. The new School embodied his philosophy that the knowledge and skills of social work should be accessible to a broad base of helping persons, not just to social workers. Dean Moore died in 1990.

Mabel Moore graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill with a social work degree in 1925. Dean and Mrs. Moore were married on September 1, 1928, and moved together to Tallahassee that year. Mrs. Moore contributed tremendously to the Tallahassee and University communities by her active involvement in Girl Scouting for eighteen years, including serving on the Girl Scout Council and being a leader. She also assisted in organizing the County Welfare Association and was later appointed to the District Welfare Board serving on it for eighteen years, including two years as President. In addition Mrs. Moore helped to organize day care services for children. Mrs. Moore strongly believed in the value that social workers can add to a community. As a measure of her commitment to social work education, she made the initial endowment to the Coyle and Mabel Moore Scholarship in the week preceding her death in 1993.

The Coyle and Mabel Moore Scholarship in Social Work is to be awarded annually to an upper level undergraduate or graduate student at Florida State University whose academic major is social work. The Scholarship is aimed at encouraging and supporting social work students who demonstrate a commitment to the social work profession. The student must exemplify the highest standard of character including demonstrated evidence of good citizenship, volunteer work, and commitment to the betterment of society and fellow humankind.

Sarah Sealey Morrill Scholarship

Community mental health colleagues from across the country, faculty from the School of Social Work at Florida State University, and Sarah's friends and family committed themselves to establishing the Sarah Sealey Morrill Endowed Scholarship. The scholarship serves as a lasting tribute to Mrs. Morrill's life-long commitment to community mental health services.

Sarah Sealey Morrill graduated from the Florida State University School of Social Work in 1955 and was a pioneering activist who helped plan and establish counseling and guidance services for children in Leon County. Later, she assumed leadership roles in planning and managing programs for the elderly. Although her home was in Leon County, her influence and leadership were felt throughout the state. She was honored by the Florida Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers as its first Social Worker of the Year. She was one of five finalists nominated by the Florida Department of Elder Affairs for Volunteer of the Year. She served as past president and chairwoman for the Florida Council for Community Mental Health, the board of the Florida Council on Aging, the Long-Term Ombudsman Council, the Florida League of Women Voters, and the National Association for Women. For over 26 years, she worked for Apalachee Community Mental Health Services. Before her retirement in 1984, she planned and directed the District Geriatric Residential Treatment System. This listing of her activities and honors, however, does not do justice to the people whose lives were touched by her wisdom and courage. Her vision and energy marked her as a social worker whose unwavering and tireless efforts made her loved by her colleagues, students and friends alike. There is no question that Sarah Sealey Morrill's legacy was to the people of Florida who benefited from her extraordinary life. This scholarship is awarded annually to a social work major as a tribute to this consummate social worker.

Dianne Harrison Montgomery, Dean Emerita
Dean of the School 1994-2000

Excerpts from the School of Social Work newsletter, *Currents*, Fall 2000

Note: Dr. Harrison officially remains a member of the School of Social Work faculty.

After twenty-four years of exceptional service and phenomenal success in the School of Social Work, Dianne Harrison Montgomery has accepted the position of Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs at Florida State University. She has forged a legacy of dedication and innovation rarely matched in academia.

If you haven't visited the School since she became dean in 1994, you're in for a treat when you do. Change has been the by-word of her administration – positive initiatives that mark a new millennium. There are new students, of course, but also new faculty, new administration, new academic offerings, new services, new community programs, and even new facilities to call home.

“We've significantly increased external funding dollars to the School, an extremely important element of furthering all aspects of our research mission,” says Dr. Harrison Montgomery. “In the area of development, we've raised the level of endowment for student scholarships. Through private contributions, we've established the Trinity Institute for the Addictions (the School's first \$1,000,000 gift!), the Institute for Family Violence Studies, the Jeanene M. Janes Professorship in Child Welfare, and the Richard M. King Fund in Social Work and Business Administration. We now have a full-time development officer and the stage is set for future fundraising successes.”

During her time as dean, Dr. Harrison Montgomery, in conjunction with faculty, initiated a number of interdisciplinary and combined degree programs, new certification programs, and a graduate minor, all academic opportunities that will enhance students' potential employability.

Recently developed interdisciplinary programs include an MSW/JD degree with the College of Law, an MSW/MBA track in partnership with the College of Business, an Arts and Community Practice program with the School of Visual Arts and Dance, and a graduate minor in Dispute Resolution.

New certification programs have also been developed in Addiction Studies, Family Social Work Practice, and Child Welfare Practice. Expanded student services now include an active Peer Advising Center, which assists students in the academic decision-making process.

Faculty members create academic opportunities, and Dr. Harrison Montgomery has been highly successful in bringing the most accomplished to the School. She states, “We've recruited a large group of outstanding new faculty, with degrees and post-docs from such places as the University of Michigan, the University of California at Berkeley, the University of Southern California, Case Western Reserve University, and Johns Hopkins.

Under her leadership, the School has reached out into the community with great success. She explains, “The faculty and administration refocused efforts to ensure that our School would be a local and statewide ‘player’ in various ways. We led an effort of the Florida Deans and Directors in Social Work to establish a formal partnership with the Florida Department of Children and Families, we established the Boys' Choir of Tallahassee in 1995 with Professor Emeritus Gerald O'Connor, and we supported the creation of the Family Visitation Program with Professor Sharon Maxwell.”

The School has grown internationally, as well, continuing to provide summer educational opportunities in London as it has added study opportunities in Prague (Czech Republic), Costa Rica, and Jamaica as part of its community service exchange program.

Having outgrown its former space in the Bellamy building, in December 1996 the School was moved to cutting-edge premier facilities in the University Center. Planning and supervising the move was quite a challenge, but well worth it. The first-rate facility includes five new classrooms, new faculty offices, faculty/staff and student lounges, three conference rooms, a state-of-the-art skills lab with interview and observation areas fully equipped with media capability for both teaching and research purposes, and a computer lab with 31 workstations.

Who is this woman who has led the School through such an incredible transformation? Dianne Harrison Montgomery has a long history of professional success. She has served as the FSU Title IX Coordinator (gender equity in athletics) since 1994 and on the Florida State Athletic Board for seven years. She is a member of the Florida Board of Regent's Council on Equity, and the principle investigator on a long-term HIV prevention research project funded by the National Institute of Health.

Serving many organizations, Dr. Harrison Montgomery is Vice President and Board member of the National Association of Deans and Directors in Social Work (NADD), chair of both the Florida Association of Deans and Directors (FADD) and the Southeastern Association of Deans and Directors (SEDD), a member of the Board of Directors of the Council on Social Work Education, and chair of the NASW Florida Task Force on Social Work Licensure.

Named the NASW Big Bend Unit Social Worker of the Year 2000, she has received both the Distinguished Alumni Award from The George Warren Brown School of Social Work at Washington University and a University Teaching Award from Florida State University. She is the author of three books and over 50 articles.
